Bluewater Health's Sexual Assault & Domestic Violence Treatment Centre is undergoing a major renovation in 2024.

Bluewater Health's Sexual Assault & Domestic Violence Treatment Centre provides a vital space for survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence. Here, they can access safe, timely and supportive care from a specially trained team of doctors and nurses. This team is dedicated to providing comprehensive care for patients who have experienced a recent sexual or domestic assault, 24 hours a day and seven days a week.

The centre sees survivors of domestic violence and intimate partner violence aged 16 and older, as well as sexual assault survivors of all ages. Victims of sex trafficking also utilize the centre. This space provides a range of critical services including forensic support, bodily fluid exposures and miscarriage support.



Supporting Survivors

This spring, the Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence Treatment Centre is undergoing a major renovation and move within the hospital. The centre, which was first established in 1987, is in need of a major refresh, with the goal of creating a tranquil and welcoming space for those accessing services.

Following an assault, it's never easy to come forward. According to Statistics Canada, *in 2021, there were 127,082 victims of police-reported and 114,132 victims of intimate partner violence across Canada*. While these numbers are high and continue to increase year over year, we know that many more cases of sexual assault and domestic violence often go unreported.

For the safety and privacy of patients, Bluewater Health offers a safe and discrete space in an unmarked area of the hospital for survivors to access when experiencing a crisis.

A Safe Space for Survivors

Providing a safe, secure and comfortable space for survivors of sexual assault, abuse and domestic violence is of the utmost importance. It is vital to a survivor's journey.

While the current space has helped hundreds of people over the years, it no longer meets the needs of our community. The revitalized treatment centre will be more spacious and provide a warm and comforting atmosphere.
